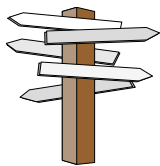

A BREIF STORY OF KNOCK

On the wet Thursday evening of the 21st August, 1879, at about the hour of 8 o'clock, Our Lady, St. Joseph, and St. John the Evangelist appeared in a blaze of Heavenly light at the south gable of the Church of St. John the Baptist. Behind them and a little to the left of St. John was a plain altar. On the altar was a cross and a lamb with adoring angels. The Apparition was seen by fifteen people one of whom was a thousand meters from the church at the time. The ages of the witnesses ranged from six years to seventy-five and included men, women, teenagers and children. The witnesses watched the Apparition in pouring rain for fully two hours, reciting the Rosary. Although the witnesses standing before the gable were drenched, no rain fell in the direction of the gable. Today, Knock ranks among the world's major Marian Shrines.

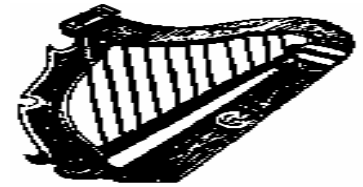

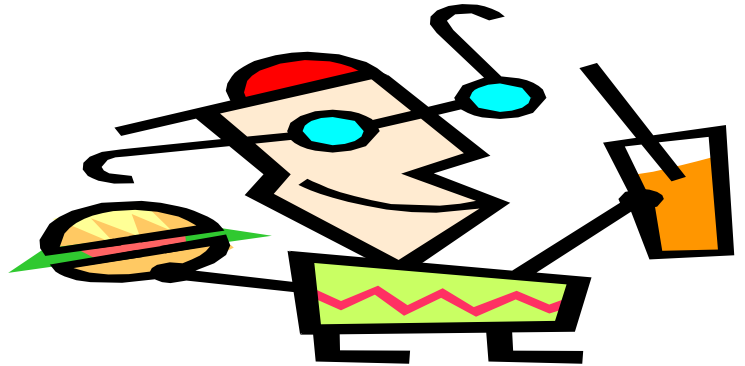
