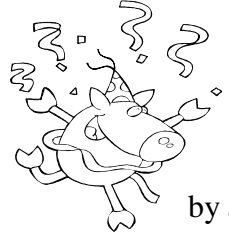

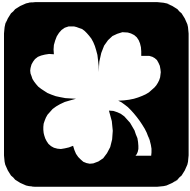
**HIBERNIAN OF THE YEAR AWARD**

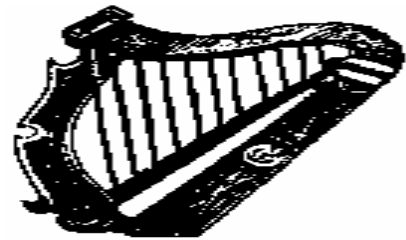

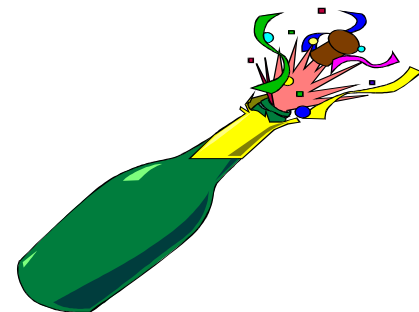
