Francis W. King, longtime Division member, passed away recently

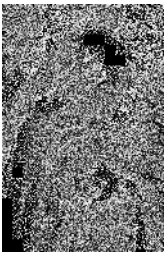

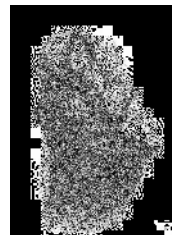

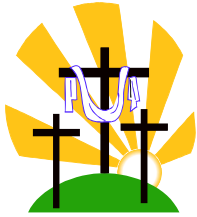
REGULAR AOH MEETING

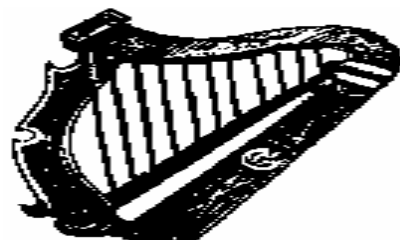
