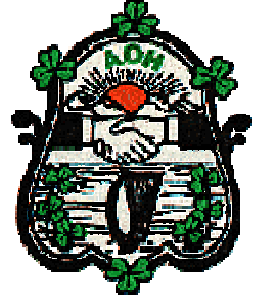

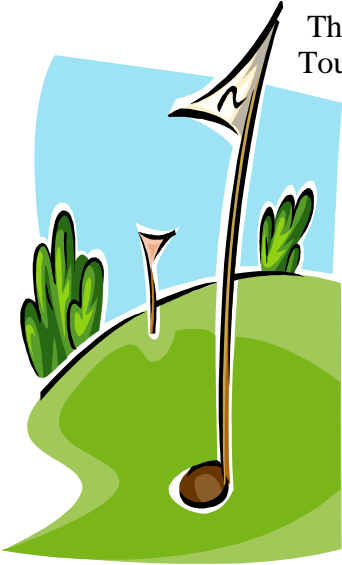
SPECIAL AOH MEETING, WEDNESDAY – OCTOBER 29

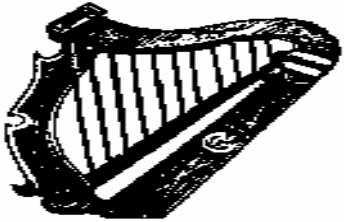

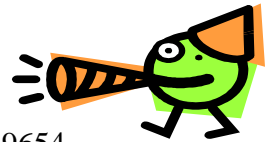
