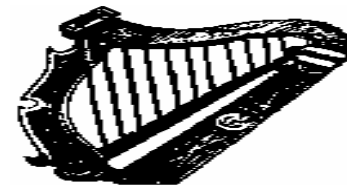

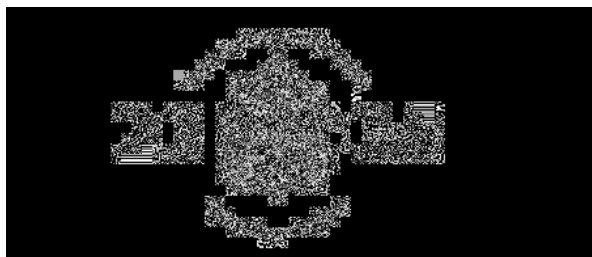
ATTENDANCE RAFFLE

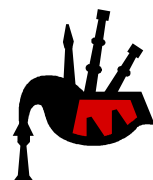
