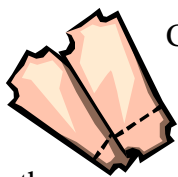
DIVISION'S ANNUAL FUND RAISING PROGRAM

SICK & VIGIL

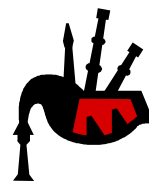
We ask that you continue to remember all our sick, deceased members and their families, and our dear friends in your prayers. Please remember the following:

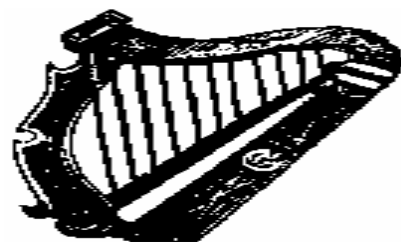
