May his soul have passed through Olde Ireland on his way to Heaven.

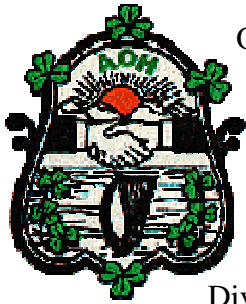

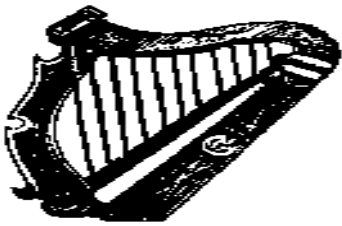
