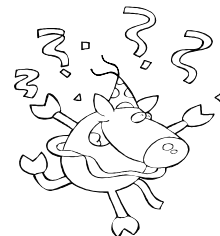

HIBERNIAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

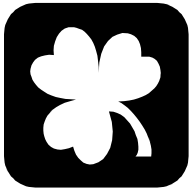

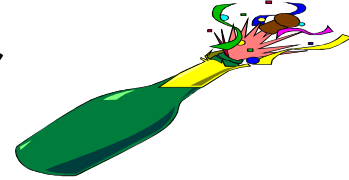
