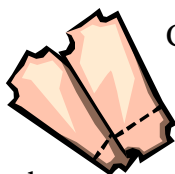

## **2008-08 Executive Board Nomination**

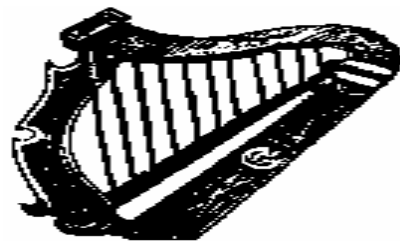
