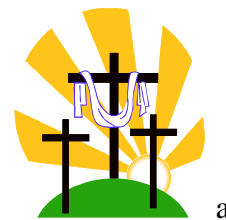

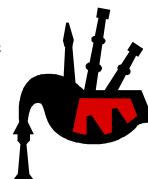

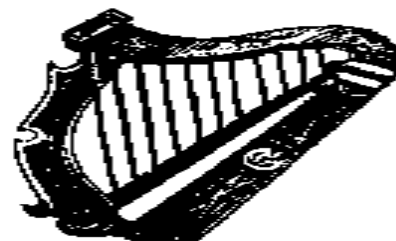
Do You Want to learn the Bagpipes?
