We would like anyone interested in discussing these ideas to please attend the meeting.

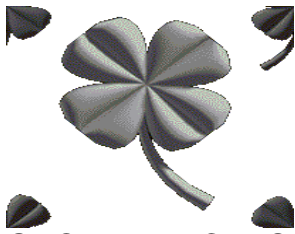
NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

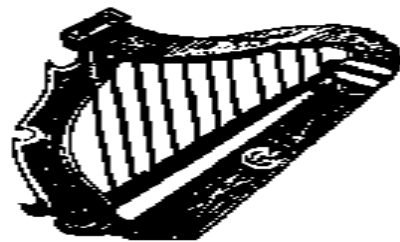
